WHAT ARE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT MANAGERS AND ESTIMATORS?

A Construction Project Manager is responsible for coordinating all facets of a construction project, from pre-construction to the completed structure. It involves the management of people and resources to control the scope, cost quality and timeframes of a project.

Project Estimators are responsible for calculating all of the required direct and indirect costs associated with a construction project.

After the 12-week training program, graduates are qualified for in-demand jobs such as Junior Project Coordinator/Manager, Junior Estimator, Junior Proposal Developer, Junior Project Administrator.

WHO CAN APPLY:

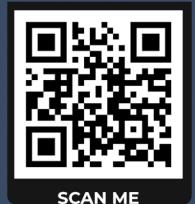
You have completed a high school diploma or a GED program from a Canadian or International education institution.
