### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Introduction to Construction Craft Worker Program is a 13-week job readiness program that includes:

- An introduction to the Construction Craft Worker Trade
- Industry-relevant safety training (WHMIS, Confined Space, Fall Protection, Workplace First Aid and CPR)
- In-class theory and hands-on training in Formwork and Concrete tasks
- Trades Math and Job Readiness Workshops
- 4 weeks of monitored work placement with a local employer

### WHAT IS A CONSTRUCTION CRAFT WORKER?

Construction craft workers primarily work on construction sites, where their tasks include site preparation, cleanup, and working with materials such as concrete, masonry, steel, wood, and pre-cast components. They contribute to a variety of structures, including industrial, commercial, and institutional projects. These workers may be employed by private companies, as well as municipal, provincial, or federal governments. Construction craft workers spend most of their time outdoors, regardless of weather conditions. They may be required to work at heights, over water, or in confined spaces and excavations. Their work settings can range from busy urban areas to remote locations. With experience and additional training, construction craft workers may specialize in different areas of construction.

### WHO CAN APPLY

Open to residents of Nova Scotia, with a focus on attracting individuals from equity-deserving groups including Indigenous Peoples, African Nova Scotians, Racially Visible Individuals, Persons with Disabilities, Newcomers, and Women.

\*Individuals must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents, and residents of Nova Scotia.

\*Participants may be connected with relevant organizations including the the Labourers' International Union of North America - Local 615, the Nova Scotia Apprenticeship Agency, and local employers.

\*Applicants to this program may also qualify for financial supports. Please discuss at time of application.
